# Breakfast clubs in partnership with Greggs Foundation

Findel has an ambition of supporting over 500 children per year in areas of deprivation, by providing support to the schools through the form of breakfast clubs which are run through the Greggs Foundation.

Breakfast clubs not only deliver a benefit through providing a meal at the start of the day, but evidence also suggests there is a direct correlation to improving attainment as a result. Club attendance can also enable parents to secure employment.

The Greggs Foundation has over 800 breakfast clubs in primary schools across the UK, with just over half being funded by external partners, and since 2013 Findel has been a key supporter of the programme. In 22/23 Findel supported 3 primary schools. Moston Lane Community Primary School in Manchester, Altmore Infant School, London and Welshpool Church in Wales Primary School, Powys.

Across the three schools supported by Findel, 165 pupils receive a free and healthy breakfast every single day. Findel are fully committed to opening more breakfast clubs in new school locations in 2023. Breakfast clubs are so much more than just a free meal. They are a chance to socialise with adults and children before the school day and an opportunity to ease into the classroom environment. Attendance at clubs helps to support better attendance and punctuality and can have a positive impact on levels of focus and attention by removing hunger as a barrier to learning.

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The positive impact our Breakfast Club programme continues to have on young learners who are primarily located in areas of deprivation and social challenge has surpassed our expectations.

There is tangible evidence that providing a great start to the day improves attainment, and responsiveness and above all strengthens general wellness and well-being. At the same time, it provides a framework that acts as an enabler for families and carers to be secure in the knowledge that their child is getting a healthy start to the day and are benefiting from positive social interaction with classmates. In some cases, they even provide access to additional support sessions such as computing and maths to bolster curricular learning and knowledge.

It is my belief that this framework also goes further and supports the wider family unit that may allow for the parent or carer to secure employment or simply be reassured, which in turn, supports the family unit as a whole.

We have now secured seven Breakfast Clubs throughout the UK and as a consequence, we are supporting over 500 children with a total of nearly 100,000 breakfasts a year, which helps support our future generation.

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

# Mock interviews and career talks

Mock interviews are a great way for young people to gain experience of what face to face interviews involve in the world of work and future opportunities. They give confidence to students, help them to develop areas of improvement and give them the best possible start in gaining success for future interviews.

Delivering careers talks is another way we're supporting raising aspirations amongst young people in our communities. We've delivered key note sessions at local high schools as part of National Apprenticeships Week and

National Careers Week. These face to face sessions are delivered to a large cohort of pupils to give insight into the world of work, talk about real experiences of career pathways and skills for the future.

# Colleague support during Childrens Mental Health Week and supporting Place2Be

Whilst supporting children in the community is important to us at Findel, we also like to take care of our colleagues and their families. As part of Childrens Mental Health Week we created activity packs that were aimed at children aged between 4 and 16 years old that promoted positive discussions at home with our colleagues (the parents) to talk about feelings, dealing with emotions and general mental health topics.

Since the pandemic there has been a 77% rise in the number of children needing specialist treatment for mental health support therefore it's our intention through 2023/24 to increase our support in this particular area.

# Derian House

Findel has supported Derian House since 2019, as its partner charity.

Derian House is a renowned children's hospice situated in the North West of England, offering support and care for children and young people with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions. The work undertaken at Derian House goes beyond mere medical support; it encompasses holistic care that addresses emotional, psychological, and social needs.

Findel has raised over £40,000 for Derian House to date

During the course of the partnership with Derian we've taken part in many different fundraising activities including skydives, a hike up Mount Snowdon, walking, cycling and running challenges along with bespoke events such as 'Bail me out' which saw 2 of our Directors 'locked up' for the day after being charged with fictional crimes.

At Findel we're proud to have supported Derian through our donations helping to fund new developments such as a new cinema room on site at Derian that allows children and their families time together to enjoy watching films, and sharing special moments in a comfortable environment which ordinarily wouldn't be possible at a conventional cinema setting.

Ellie Smith, Fundraising Manager at Derian said:

"We are truly thankful and appreciative of the support that Findel has provided to Derian House over the last 12 years. Findel first supported the hospice in 2019 and has donated a phenomenal total over £40,000 for our children and their families.

Derian House Children's Hospice provides care and respite to more than 400 babies, children and young people with life-limiting conditions across the North West. In 2023, it costs £6 million to provide services at Derian House but we only receive a small percentage of this from NHS funding; for the rest we rely heavily on the generosity of our friends within the community like the team at Findel Education who have climbed mountains and jumped out of planes to help us keep our doors open to those who need us!

This year, Team Findel have generously visited with their funds raised at their office Christmas markets and supported one of our mini heroes, Oscar Burrows' school with books and educational products and we cannot thank them enough for their kindness."

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# Cherished

Cherished is a charity who provide attachment-focused and trauma responsive support for children and young people in Primary and Secondary schools across Birmingham. Cherished is their service to support girls, and Roar supports boys. The support that they offer includes 1:1 mentoring, school courses, Blossom and Roar groups, workshops and events. They also offer training for parents, carers and professionals and volunteering opportunities.

When we were first introduced to Hannah the CEO from Cherished we were struck by her passion and commitment to supporting children and young people who are in much need of support within her community.

Whilst the charity doesn't directly support our local communities, we are very much a national business and we knew we had to do something to support Cherished.

In July 2022, we asked Hannah how we could help, and as a result we donated £1,000 worth of products all designed to support mental health and well-being, and some much needed stationery items to allow the team to continue to produce their valuable resources.



In the Summer of 2023, we also provided 300 back to school stationery packs for year 6 children who were starting secondary school in September, basic resources that these children otherwise wouldn't have had.

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
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# Supporting our communities

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
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# The Place - Tree planting





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# Supporting the environment

Through the Findel Forest, we will lower our environmental impact by reducing carbon, restoring nature, and promoting biodiversity through tangible and meaningful projects.

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In its simplest sense, sustainability is about meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. At Findel, our business is all about growing education for generations and it has never been more important than now to do so responsibly. The start of FY23 saw our carbon reduction pathway approved by the Science Based Targets initiative, generally regarded as the most reputable climate mitigation initiative available in the corporate sector. We also had to meet the year 1 requirements of our innovative sustainability linked loan facility with Santander, including a stretching emissions reduction across Scopes 1 and 2. Through various factors, including a drive of energy and resource reduction, renewable electricity, and carbon neutral gas supplies, I'm very proud that we superseded our emissions target by over 80%, setting the tone for not only our sustainability commitment of today, but also of the future.

# Just One Tree

In 2021, in order to help fulfil our commitment to reducing our carbon footprint, we decided to start supporting the reforestation charity Just One Tree.

Just One Tree works by funding local reforestation organisations to go into local communities in heavily deforested areas and train them up to plant and take care of the trees. This training includes sourcing and planting only native species and caring for the trees from seeds through to maturity.


Trees are vital for removing carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere and helping in the fight against climate change. 1000 trees removes about 12.32 tonnes of CO2 a year.

# Ecologi

At the beginning of 2023, we announced our latest partnership with Ecologi. As well as funding numerous reforestation projects, it helps other carbon reduction initiatives like building solar and wind power farms, converting waste rice husks to power and repairing water boreholes. This built from our work with Just One Tree last year, and we hope this is the beginning of a long and impactful partnership.

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# Rio Ferdinand Foundation Communities Programme

In May 2023 we launched our partnership with the Rio Ferdinand Foundation in the roll out of our bespoke 'Communities Programme' that will be delivered across Manchester, Tameside, Oldham and Salford.

The programme will offer young people from Greater Manchester an exciting and progressive three-year programme bursting with skills development opportunities in Sport, Music, Digital, Media and Technology.

Through our programme we will target the priorities and needs of our diverse communities, leading positive change for young people in Greater Manchester and throughout the Northwest.

In addition to uniting communities through sport, music and the arts, the programme will provide creative accredited training for young people to boost their CVs and raise their aspirations to achieve.






