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Giving children the right start

When children receive the right care and support during their formative years, they are more likely to reach their full potential. That's why a significant proportion of the Findel Foundation's work is dedicated to doing exactly that: Giving children the best possible start, whether it's a proper meal to begin the day or an introduction to the world of work.

Partnership with the Greggs Foundation

During FY24, Findel proudly supported eight breakfast clubs across the UK, covering regions in England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland. By funding these clubs, we have been able to provide over 600 pupils per day with a nutritious start to their day, which makes a significant difference in their overall well-being and academic performance. This Figure over 600+ children surpassed our target of supporting 500+ by 2025 meaning more children across the UK are benefitting from our support.

The positive effects of school breakfast clubs are well-documented. Studies show that a healthy breakfast can improve pupil's concentration, behaviour, and academic attainment. By removing hunger as a barrier to learning, breakfast clubs help children focus better in class. Leading to improved educational outcomes.

Additionally, breakfast clubs contribute to the circular economy by enabling parents to seek employment. With the assurance that their children are receiving a free and healthy meal at the start of the day, parents can take up jobs & volunteering opportunities, which in turn supports the broader economy and strengthens community resilience.

The Greggs Foundation operates over 900 breakfast clubs in primary schools across the UK, with just over half being funded by external partners. Findel has been a key supporter of this programme since 2013. In 2023/24, our commitment expanded to eight schools, significantly impacting the lives of students and their families.

Findel remains fully committed to partnership with the Greggs Foundation which continues to be a cornerstone of our corporate social responsibility efforts, reflecting our dedication to making a positive impact on Children's lives and their communities.

Partnership with Greggs Foundation

We asked Lynne Hindmarch, Partnerships Manager at the Greggs Foundation to share her thoughts on the Findel partnership

"The Greggs Foundation Breakfast Clubs Programme has been running for 25 years and we support over 62,000 children daily with a free nutritious breakfast at over 900 school clubs nationwide. Breakfast Clubs offer so much more than food, they are a chance for children to socialize before lessons, support working parents and help to improve concentration and punctuality in schools.

Findel have been a truly wonderful partner in our Breakfast Club programme for over 10 years. They have really gone the extra mile to ensure that their support for the children and the breakfast Clubs goes beyond providing funding to be a present and engaged part of the school communities. This is exactly the added value we hope partners will bring when they join the programme. Thank you to Findel for your support."

We also asked one of our Breakfast club Schools headteachers about what it means to them to be funded by Findel.

"At Pennyburn Primary we are incredibly fortunate to have received funding for a full-school breakfast club this session from Findel. All of our pupils have the opportunity to attend, which completely removes any stigma that would have arisen from a targeted service. The Breakfast Club sets the tone for our school day, showing pupils that their 'good morning' is a priority. They are offered a healthy, balanced breakfast and the opportunity to relax or enjoy activities with their friends before their lessons. Pupils are eager to come to the club, resulting in a decrease in late-comings and an increase in overall attendance.

When our lessons do start, class teachers across the school have noted that children are more focussed and ready to learn.

Our tracking has also shown a positive impact on our attainment since the Breakfast Club began. Our parents speak very highly of the Breakfast Club. This service has also allowed a number of parents to apply for college courses and jobs they would not have before been able to. This has an unmeasurable impact on our families and community. We are truly grateful for this opportunity and our partnership with Findel."

Inspiring the next generation


Delivering careers talks is something we're passionate about at Findel. Our careers support aligns to the Gatsby Benchmarks supporting schools to achieve and exceed in all of these standards.

We've delivered key note sessions at local high schools as part of National Apprenticeships Week and National Careers Week. As well as supporting early careers insights delivering sessions as part of primary school Enterprise Days. These face to face sessions are delivered to a large cohort of pupils to give insight into the world of work, talk about real experiences of career pathways and skills for the future.

Additionally, mock interviews are a great way for young people to gain experience of what face to face interviews involve in the world of work and future opportunities. They give confidence to students, help them to develop areas of improvement and give them the best possible start in gaining success for future interviews. Findel were invited to take part in an Enterprise Day at English Martyrs Primary School in Urmston. We delivered a whole school assembly speaking about the importance of Maths and how it's used every day in business and how Maths is used in different roles within businesses.

Danielle Darkin, Teacher at English Martyrs said: "It was great to have Findel on board with our Enterprise Project, they really inspired the children with some different ways to make £10 grow and created a buzz of excitement around the school."

Claire Gleave of Findel said: "It was brilliant to be a part of the schools enterprise day, and what really sparked my interest in getting involved in this one was that it was delivered to primary school ages. The majority of careers and workplace encounters are aimed at high school age children, so was thrilled to help out as it's never too early to engage young people and open their eyes to future possibilities so they can flourish."













Findel takeover day

As part of National Careers Week 2024, eleven dedicated Findel colleagues delivered the inaugural 'Findel Takeover' event at Longdendale High School, engaging the entire Year 9 cohort. Around 180 students participated in the event, deepening their understanding and presenting their learnings – a fantastic testament to their future potential. This immersive day provided young people with the opportunity to hear and see firsthand from professionals in various roles within Findel. By sharing their experiences and insights, our colleagues helped students gain a clearer understanding of the different career paths available to them. This initiative aligns with the Gatsby Benchmarks for schools, supporting effective career guidance and preparing students for the future. The enthusiasm and participation of the students were inspiring, highlighting the impact of real-world experiences on their educational journey. We are proud to contribute to their growth and look forward to more events that bridge the gap between education and the professional world.



Our tree planting efforts align with several United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including Climate Action (SDG 13), Life on Land (SDG 15), and Sustainable Cities and Communities (SDG 11). By contributing to these objectives, we demonstrate our commitment to sustainable development and responsible citizenship.
- Long-term Business Sustainability. Investing in environmental sustainability initiatives like tree planting ensures the long-term health and viability of the markets we serve. A stable and healthy environment is essential for the continued success of our business and the wellbeing of our stakeholders. By protecting and enhancing natural ecosystems, we safeguard the resources and conditions necessary for future growth and innovation.





Findel Forest

Since 2021, we have partnered with JustOneTree to fund the activities of reforestation organisations, training and working with communities in heavily deforested areas to plant and nurture trees. This includes only sourcing and planting native species and caring for trees from seeds to maturity. During our partnership with we have planted over 1,700 trees together across the world from Brazil to Zambia.

In 2023 however we began our transition to a new tree planting partner - Ecologi - whose objectivesand plans in this arena are unrivalled whilst also enabling us to expand our impact to include carbon avoidance, carbon removal and habitat restoration. To end FY24 we have already planted over 2,400 trees together and in FY25 have committed to planting a tree for every new customer from which we expect to see exponential growth.

Our commitment to global tree planting is a testament to our dedication to environmental stewardship, educational enrichment, community engagement, and sustainable development. Through these efforts, we aim to create a lasting positive impact on the planet, ensuring a better future for the communities we serve and the generations to come.

Communities Programme

In April 2023 we announed our bespoke 'Communities Programme' with our partner, Rio Ferdinand Foundation that is being delivered across Manchester, Tameside, Oldham and Salford. The programme offers young people from Greater Manchester an exciting and progressive three-year programme bursting with skills development opportunities in Sport, Music, Digital, Media and Technology. Through our programme

we 've been targeting the priorities and needs of our diverse communities, leading positive change for young people in Greater Manchester and throughout the Northwest. In addition to uniting communities through sport, music and the arts, the programme has provided creative accredited training for young people to boost their CVs and raise their aspirations. In our first year FY24 we were delighted to have achieved or exceeded our year 1 targets delivering support to over 400 young people across the Northwest.

Some of the projects include:

- Facilitation of an all-male sports project at Loreto College in Manchester, which included qualifications in Sports Leadership & EDI.
- An all-female Tech & Arts based programme at Rayner Stevens High School in Dukinfield including activities using arts/crafts, coding/robotics & filmmaking/podcasting, alongside of a Bronze Arts Award and L1 Leadership qualification.
- A 12-week emotional health and wellbeing project for children at St Peter's Primary School in Swinton, delivering a mixture of sports, arts and media-based activities themed around wellbeing.
- Plus, 1:1 support and mentoring for 10 young people across the Northwest.


